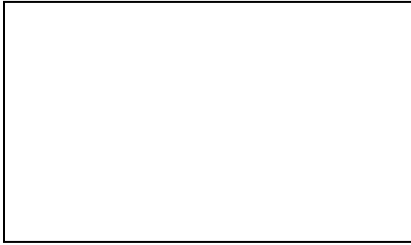
STATEROOM AMENITIES

DINING INFORMATION

Dining has always been the premier event of any Cunard voyage, a gustatory celebration where superb culinary creations are proudly served by waiters trained in the fine art of Cunard White Star Service™. Clearly, lavish dining is the centerpiece of the Queen Mary 2 experience, as well - with vastly expanded menus and venues.

There are 10 restaurants in all, served by a team of chefs that includes the celebrated Mediterranean and TV culinary luminary Todd English. As with the custom of ocean liners in the past, each Queen Mary 2 stateroom is matched with a reserved table at a sea-view restaurant, complemented by the largest wine selection afloat. Of course, you can always make reservations at one of the many optional dining alternatives. Or don't dine out - dine in! Complimentary room service is available 24 hours a day.

Todd English

You can make reservations at the Todd English restaurant and enjoy delectable Mediterranean cuisine -- al fresco if you choose. There will be a nominal fee of \$20pp for lunch or \$30pp for dinner. Bar beverages are not included. Owner of the internationally famous Olives of Boston among others, Todd English, is one of America's leading chefs. Chef English has appeared in numerous television shows including his own TV series *Cooking in with Todd English*.

Kings Court

A casual dining venue for breakfast and lunch that at night is transformed, through lighting and special screens, into four intimate dining venues. Distinctive china, menus, wine lists and waiter uniforms will distinguish each restaurant. **Lotus**, which will serve Asian cuisine, including Chinese, Thai, Japanese and Indian. **La Piazza**, a 24-hour restaurant serving pasta, pizza and other Italian specialties. **The Carvery** is a deliberate nod to Cunard's rich, British heritage. Here diners can enjoy the finest carved beef, lamb, pork and poultry. **Chef's Galley**, where you can watch a master cook at work – then enjoy the fruits of his labors brought straight to your table. For Chef's Galley, a fee of \$35pp will be charged. Bar beverages are not included.

Golden Lion Pub

Fine lagers, ales and pub snacks are served in this charming British pub where you can enjoy a pint and watch televised sporting events.

Boardwalk Café

Enjoy lunch at this casual eatery near the pool - in your bathing suit if you choose.

Winter Garden

A proper British afternoon tea can be taken in the Winter Garden or Queens Grill Lounge. Naturally it's served freshly brewed (no tea bags here), complete with scones, clotted cream, fresh pastries, finger sandwiches and white glove service.

What does single-seating dining mean? It means there is just the one sitting for dinner, and guests can choose to dine anytime between 7 and 9pm. On QM2 and QE2, the Britannia and Mauretania restaurants respectively offer a choice of an early or a late sitting for dinner. All other restaurants are single seating dining.

One of the great thrills of a Cunard cruise is the sheer glamour of the evenings. Generally, evening dress may be either formal or informal when your ship is at sea, and informal or casual when your ship is in port. There will be a maximum of three formal nights in a week. Evening attire, effective from 6 pm, will be specified in your ship's Daily Programme, delivered to your stateroom each day. Dress codes are defined as follows:

FORMAL: Tuxedo (or formal dark suit) for men. Evening gown or other formal attire for women.

INFORMAL: Jacket and tie for men. Cocktail dress, dressy trouser suit or similar for women.

CASUAL: For men, slacks and a sweater or shirt. For women, skirt or slacks with a sweater or blouse. A range of formal wear is available to hire on board ship.

To make it easy for you to say 'thank you' to your stateroom steward, dining room waiter and other key personnel for their on-board service, a suggested per person amount will automatically be charged to your shipboard account and distributed to these crewmembers. Recommended daily amounts vary by ship and accommodation grade as follows:

For bar and salon services, a 15% service charge is added to your on-board account.

Currency aboard QM2 and QE2 is US dollars and Caronia is £ sterling. Aboard all ships, you'll find the Purser's Office acts as a handy financial centre. You don't need to take cash, as all shipboard purchases are charged to your on-board account. You can settle your account by credit card or using traveler's cheques. To make life easier, we recommend you register your credit card at the start of your holiday. You can exchange cash and traveler's cheques at the Purser's Office for most currencies in use at ports of call. Please note that personal cheques cannot be cashed on board.
